Probably many members will have seen it several times during the 38 years since it was made but it remains one of the greatest satirical comedies ever. For the one or two who don't know about it, the film tells the story of Brian (Graham Chapman) a nice young man living in Jerusalem at the time of the Roman Empire, much loved by his mother (Terry Jones). By some unhappy coincidences the mob become convinced that Brian is the Messiah that they are desperately hoping for and will not be convinced by Brian's denials that he is not but merely just an ordinary person. But the Python's don't restrict their satire to religious zealotry. The jokes come thick and fast and the targets are many and varied. So remember - Always Look on the Bright Side of Life !!

I've Loved You So Long (M) 2009

Phillipe Claudel: starring Kristin Scott Thomas, Elsa Zylberstein, Serge Hazanavicius | 117 mins This is quite possibly, Kristin Scott Thomas's finest role, for which she won 7 international awards and was nominated for 11 more. Juliette (Scott Thomas) has been serving a fifteen year prison term for a crime that, at the beginning of the film we know nothing about. She is obliged to live with her much younger sister, brother-in-law and nieces and have regular sessions with her parole officer. Gradually the story unfolds and we learn of the past as the two sisters learn to know each other again and Juliette learns to live in the real world again. Most unusually Phillipe Claudel actually wrote the story as a novel and then adapted it to the screen himself as well as directing it. It is a beautiful and deeply moving film that will leave you pondering what would you have done if you had been Juliette.
