

Spanish language - subtitles dir. David Trueba: starring Javier Camara, Natalia de Molina, Francesc Colomer 108 mins It is 1966 and Spain is still under the repressive hand of El Generalissimo. The Beatles are at the height of their fame. Antonio (Javier Camara) is a high school teacher and such a Beatles fan that he uses the lyrics of their songs as teaching material in his English classes. When he hears that John Lennon is filming on location in Almeria, he decides to drive down there to try to see him and thank him for being such an inspiration. On the way he picks up two young hitch-hikers both of whom are fleeing from repressive situations. The warmth of Antonio's personality helps the youngsters come to terms with their problems. Although living is easy with your eyes closed it is much more interesting to have them open. Written and directed by David Trueba it totally scooped the pool at the Goyas. This is the third film starring Javier Camara we have shown this year (Talk to Her and Truman were the others). What a fine actor he is..

Clint Eastwood: starring Tom Hanks, Aaron Eckhart, Laura Linney, 96 mins You can always rely on Clint Eastwood to create a properly made drama in the very best traditions of Hollywood story telling. And with Tom Hanks in the title role you know that you will be captured by it. The deliberate landing of a US Airways airliner in New York's Hudson River by Captain Sullenberger (known affectionately as Sully) after an emergency engine failure was worldwide news in 2009. The film deals with this emergency but more importantly with the subsequent investigations and the fight that Sully faced to clear his name and to demonstrate that he and his co-pilot made the correct decisions which saved everybody's life. Part bio-pic, part emergency action thriller, part courtroom drama, Sully is absorbing and highly satisfying.
