Spanish language - sub-titles dir. Pedro Almadóvar starring Emma Suárez, Adriana Ugarte, Daniel Gran 99 mins.

“You may enjoy Julieta more if you know that it is a women’s film from the melodrama genre and a story of pure emotion. While it is labelled a romance it is nothing like a romance and don’t expect light entertainment or laughs as the film is devoid of humour. What it does have is an outpouring of quintessentially maternal guilt and self-absorbed loss that is palpable throughout the film. While critics may be divided, this is a beautiful film with a long aftertaste.” It seemed to me that this paragraph from a review in Cinemuse was as good an introduction as any I could give. This is of course the latest offering from the great Spanish master Pedro Almedóvar and should probably be considered as mandatory viewing for all serious film fans. The story concerns Julieta, a middle-aged widow (Suarez) as she traverses her past life in search of her daughter Antia (Gran) and the truth about her younger self (Ugarte). Bush Christmas 1983

dir. Henri Safran: starring John Ewart, John Howard, Nicole Kidman 91 mins

What goes around comes around! First made in 1947 starring Chips Rafferty Bush Christmas is a tale of derring-do aimed firmly at what is now fashionably called the “young-adult” audience. Updated here in 1983 in a version that brings in drought and its consequences for the bush and which eliminates the moral dilemmas of the relationships with horse thieves it is still a good reminder that Christmas for us does not consist of log-fires, snow and robin redbreasts tweeting in frozen hedgerows. And that Australian society is unique and not some pale imitation of Britain or America . Notable for the first starring roles of a seventeen year old Nicole Kid-man and a twenty year old John Howard it tells the story of how a bunch of kids ride out into the bush and reclaim their family’s prize horse and thwart the dastardly horse thieves. And not a sprig of holly or mistletoe in sight!!!
